

Spring Arts Internships Opportunity

The **USF Contemporary Art Museum's Art In Health** program has two internship opportunities for qualified art students during Spring 2017. Sessions are scheduled one half day per week (roughly 3.5 hours), January 10th - April 25th.

Interns will actively utilize art processes within a professional healthcare clinic setting with clients, speech-language pathology graduate students and faculty. The clinic is located on campus.

Applicants must be advanced students with:

- Solid visual arts skills in one or more media and comfort with basic drawing
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills
- Strong interest in gaining experience in working with the arts in healthcare or teaching profession settings
- Openness to working in a collaborative and mentored environment

**There is also opportunity for graduate level participation in arts facilitation, applied arts research or project development under program supervision.

To Apply: Applicants must interview; provide a resume; provide names and contact info for three references (two from USF faculty); and send via email or link 10 images of portfolio work.

Review of applicants begins Nov 21 and continues until filled.
